Dear Bentley Community,

As we congratulate and celebrate the Bentley Class of 2022, we are hopeful and encouraged that our students and community are beginning to heal from the circumstances that the pandemic laid upon us. For all of the negative impacts these circumstances led to, I truly believe that in some sense, our families were brought closer together and we were able to see, again, the sense of community that lives within our district. With the worst of the pandemic behind us, we have become acutely aware of our successes and deficits.

With involvement from students, parents, staff, and community members, strategic planning is well underway, and I am encouraged with the direction our district is going. Every stakeholder is important to us, and it is crucial that all voices are heard. Although many may not know the complexities that are involved in serving as a board member, I assure you that each one of us that has the honor of serving on the board shares one common goal: to serve our students in the best way possible. Sometimes complex decisions need to be made. I am proud to say that our board members are thoughtful and work together in every decision we make in service of all children.

As we have witnessed the hardship and struggles of the last two graduating classes, as well as the class of 2022, I ask you to focus on all of the accomplishments our students have achieved and realize how our students have persevered through circumstances that many of us, as adults, had not faced in our lifetime until now. Our students deserve to feel a sense of pride, and we must make sure that they know we support them.

Over the past three months, the Board of Education worked with Michigan Association of School Boards (MASB) to engage in future planning for Bentley Community Schools. The planning involved collecting and analyzing data. then identifying opportunities for improvement. Specifically, input was sought in face-to-face conversations with the board of education. administration, staff and faculty from each building, middle and high school students, as well as families and the broader community. Additionally, approximately 200 stakeholder surveys were submitted. In each forum, feedback was given about current district strengths. possible areas of improvement, possible barriers to implementing a strategic plan, and a possible restated vision.

Following these data gathering sessions, a full-day retreat was held on Saturday, April 30 during which 35 participants—including board members, staff, students, and community members—looked at academic data for Bentley and four other demographically similar schools. They also looked at the perception data gathered from the surveys and stakeholder conversations. Given all these inputs, this group re-visited the existing belief, mission, and vision statements offering suggestions for our next five-year planning cycle, which the Board will soon take action on. Additionally, five new broad goals have been set:



ACADEMICS/PROGRAMS

Bentley Community Schools will ensure students are ready for college and/or career and life.

COMMUNICATIONS/ COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Bentley Community Schools will engage and update community, staff and students.

CULTURE/LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

Bentley Community Schools will create programming to enhance culture, diversity, and student voice/leadership.

PERSONNEL/LEADERSHIP

Bentley Community Schools will have a 5-year plan to assess staffing concerns, communication issues, and formalize onboarding procedure with yearly review.

OPERATIONS

Bentley Community Schools will establish procedures and timelines for infrastructure improvements by evaluating district needs.

The Board of Education and district look forward to continuing to make Bentley the best small but mighty district for our students and staff.

Art

Bentley artists have been busy this year creating beautiful, high quality artwork. They have participated in two local art shows, the MAEA (Michigan Art Educators Association) and the GFAC (Greater Flint Arts Council). We cover topics in this class such as web development, app development, game development, digital information, and the internet, to name a few. These Bentley students use the industryrecognized standard of Code. org as the platform for their learning, and have been having a blast this year.



Yearbook

The 2022 yearbook has been delivered! Guided and directed by advisor Mrs. Mohrman, twenty-four yearbook students worked as a team to create a high quality book that everyone could be proud of. Our cover design was designed and illustrated by Bulldog senior Emilee Howart. We received the National Yearbook of Excellence "silver" level award, which is pretty awesome for a small high school. We are thankful for all the local companies that bought ads in our yearbook to help contribute to the cost of creating this book.

School of Choice Applications Now Available

Bentley Community Schools will again participate in the 105 State School of Choice program, accepting unlimited applications for kindergarten – 5th grade and 7th-12th grade.

Applications are available online from May 4th through August 18, 2022. You can also pick up an application in the Administration Office. The deadline to submit applications is Thursday, August 18th, at 4:00 p.m.

Limited applications will be accepted for 6th grade only from July 13 – August 11, 2022. A lottery process will be used if we receive more applications than we can accept for 6th grade, i.e. 6th grade applications are not accepted on a first come, first served basis.
